 (after participation of several European mathematicians to an AWM-organized roundtable at the ICM 1986 in Berkeley)
- Registered as an association since 1993 (in Finland, with seat in Helsinki)
- Non-profit
- Represented in currently 32 countries
- Membership open to all women; men (and organizations) can be supporting members
- Approximately 400 members
